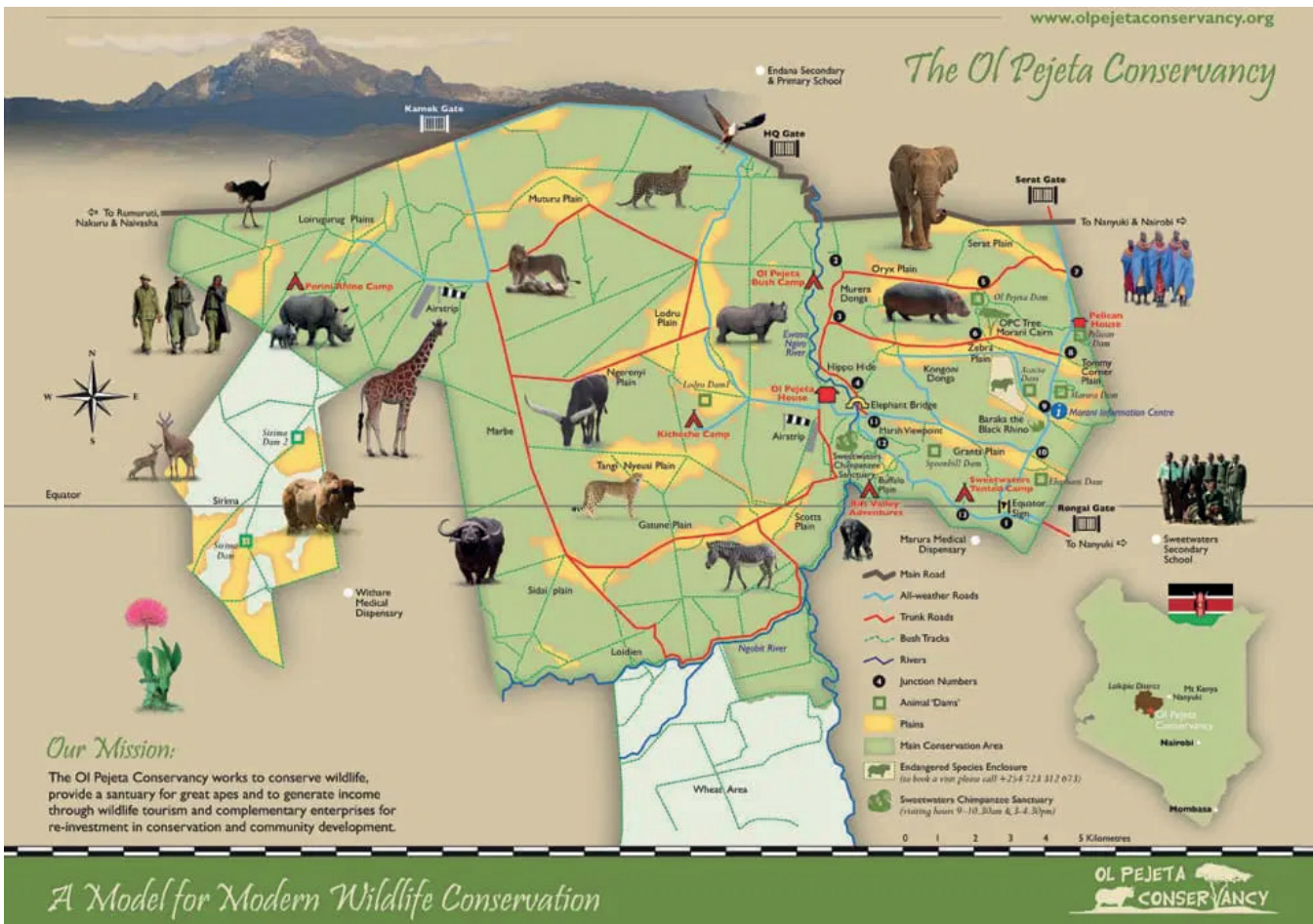


PORINI RHINO CAMP



Located in the Ol Pejeta Conservancy, Porini Rhino Camp offers unmatched rhino sightings and Big Five encounters. With just seven eco-friendly tents and solar power, this secluded camp provides an exclusive, low-impact safari experience in one of Kenya's leading private wildlife sanctuaries. A key highlight is the **camp's special hide located near a watering hole**. Guests can view and photograph wildlife from this amazing vantage point.



LOCATION AND ACCESS

Porini Rhino Camp is located within the 90,000-acre Ol Pejeta Conservancy in Laikipia, central Kenya. This land, once a cattle ranch, was converted into a premier conservation area with a focus on protecting endangered species. It seeks to support the people living around its borders, benefiting them directly through jobs, education, and healthcare funded by tourism revenues.

Guests at Porini Rhino Camp enjoy exclusive access to this wildlife haven, home to Kenya's largest black rhino population, along with elephants, lions, chimpanzees, and more. With limited camps within the conservancy, privacy is guaranteed.

Getting There:

- Schedule a flight from Nairobi's Jomo Kenyatta International Airport or Wilson Airport to Kamok Airstrip.
- Organise a private charter directly to the Kamok Airstrip.
- Travel by car from Nairobi to Ol Pejeta Conservancy via Nanyuki (approximate driving duration is 3.5 hours)
- Complimentary airstrip / airport transfers to / from Kamok.
- Distance from Nairobi to Selenkay Conservancy: 250 kilometers or 155 miles

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Tucked away in the renowned 90,000-acre Ol Pejeta Conservancy, Porini Rhino Camp is a rare gem for conservation-minded travelers. This eco-camp is surrounded by one of East Africa's most successful private wildlife sanctuaries — home to the Big Five, over 160 black rhinos, over 40 southern white rhinos and the last two northern white rhinos on Earth

The camp's serene woodland setting, along a seasonal riverbed, offers an immersive wilderness experience with minimal impact on the environment. As the only Porini camp in the central highlands, it grants guests exclusive access to game-rich savannahs and the endangered species enclosures.

Beyond wildlife viewing, Porini Rhino offers intimate access to Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary and supports local communities through education and employment. Here, luxury meets purpose in a setting where every stay actively contributes to the future of African wildlife.

CONSERVANCIES

Porini Rhino Camp is located in the 90,000-acre Ol Pejeta Conservancy, a leading wildlife reserve situated between the Aberdare Mountains and Mount Kenya. The conservancy is home to the Big Five and holds the largest population of black rhinos in East Africa, along with the world's last two northern white rhinos under 24-hour protection. The camp has nine guest tents, including two family units, set along a seasonal river in a wooded area. Activities include game drives in custom 4x4 vehicles, guided bush walks with Maasai warriors, and visits to the Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary and the Endangered Species Enclosure. A wildlife viewing hide is located at a waterhole near the camp. Porini Rhino Camp supports a sustainable conservation model where tourism revenue contributes significantly to the conservancy's operating costs, including efforts to protect endangered wildlife such as the black rhino.

SUSTAINABILITY

Porini Rhino Camp is a model of eco-tourism, built and operated to leave a minimal footprint while maximizing conservation impact. If the camp were to be moved, in a few months and with some rains one would not know there was anything there. This gold eco-rated camp runs on solar power, uses environmentally sensitive materials, and avoids permanent infrastructure to preserve the land's natural integrity. Guests have the opportunity to support the Wildlife Habitat Trust (WHT), with 100% of donations going directly to our community. Every guest stay directly supports conservation management, helping to protect biodiversity, restore habitats, and maintain the health of the ecosystem. By prioritizing sustainability at every level, Porini sets a standard for responsible tourism in Africa.

COMMUNITY

Porini Camps were established on a foundation of partnership with local landowners, creating a conservation model that benefits both people and nature. Through long-term land lease payments, employment opportunities, and community development support, Porini helps sustain livelihoods while incentivizing the protection of wildlife habitat.

Guests are welcomed into this relationship and can engage meaningfully through cultural visits to villages or schools—fostering connection, understanding, and mutual respect. This shared approach ensures that conservation success is deeply rooted in community support.

Additionally, guests have the opportunity to support community initiatives through the Wildlife Habitat Trust, which funds projects focused on education, healthcare, and sustainable livelihoods—such as youth beekeeping programs. Every contribution goes entirely to the projects, ensuring direct and meaningful impact.
